Akari Light Sculptures

In 1951 the Japanese-American artist Isamu Noguchi began to design the Akari Light Sculptures, a group of works handcrafted out of washi paper that eventually comprised over 100 luminaires – table, floor and ceiling lamps. He chose the name Akari for these objects, a word that means ‘light’ in Japanese, connoting both illumination and physical lightness.

Lampshades: washi paper, some partially painted. Some models with end pieces in wood/bamboo.

Structure: bamboo/steel wire.

Legs: painted steel wire.

Light source: 4W LED

Socket: E27

Dimmability: not dimmable.

Kelvin: 2700 K (warm white).

Plug: Euro flat, 2-pin (type C plug).

Max. watt: 12 W

Energy efficiency: F

Cable length for table lamps: 130 cm.

Cable length for floor lamps: 300 cm.
